John Foster (before 1767 - late 1824 or January 1825) Shipbuilder

1. **JOHN FOSTER** was born in 1767 or earlier in England.

Father: (unknown) Mother: (unknown)

~ before 1767

He was recorded in the "age 50 or over" column in the 1817 census of Pictou, Nova Scotia. So that will make him born 1767 or earlier.

My feeling is that he probably was born in the 1750's or early 1760's. His son John Foster (junior) was born ca. 1786, then there is one son who is older than John Jr. Henry Foster was described in the father's Will as the oldest son.

Since John Foster junior was born in London, England, it would be normal to assume that John Foster senior was born in England.

~ early 1780's

John Foster married (name unknown) perhaps before 1785 in England.

~ before 1786

Their son, Henry Foster, was born before 1786 in England.

~ 1786

Their son, John Foster, was born ca. 1786 in London, England.

~ between 1786 and 1792

John Foster and his wife and two sons sailed from England, perhaps London, between 1786 and 1792.

That time period is base on son John being born in London, England in ca. 1786 and son William being born in 1792 on St. John's Island (Prince Edward island, Canada).

~ 1792

Their son, William Foster, was born 2 May 1792 on St. John's Island (Prince Edward Island, Canada).

~ 1794

Their son, Paul Foster, was born 9 December 1794.

~ 1796

Their son, George Foster, was born ca. 1796 on St. John's Island (Prince Edward Island, Canada).

~ 1798

In 1798, Mrs. "Forster" was living in Lot 64 of St. John's Island. There were 5 people in the household. 4 were males of the age under 16.

John Foster and his oldest son were probably away at the time of the census of 1798 was taken.

St. John's Island is better known with its later name, Prince Edward Island.

When you look at the map of Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia, you will see that Lot 64 or Murray Harbour of Prince Edward Island is the closest point on the Island to Pictou across the sea.

~ 1804 to 1805

John Foster gave in 5 shillings toward funds being raised for building a meeting house frame.

On 8 May 1805, John Foster purchased a 100 acres lot of land at Fisher's Grant, Pictou county, Nova Scotia. He paid 50 pounds to John Patterson Sr. His friend Francis Carmichael was the witness at the signing.

The deed was recorded on 3 October 1813.



~ 1812

On 11 January 1812, John Foster was a witness when his son, William Foster, bought a property in Fisher's Grant, Pictou county, Nova Scotia from Alexander Kennedy.

The indenture was registered on 1 February 1818.

See below in the history on William Foster (1792-1855) for details on the deed record.

~ 1814 and 1816

John McDougald, Senior, sold a property to his son William McDougald. The lot of land is situated in Fisher's Grant, Pictou county, Nova Scotia.

In the deed it mentioned that part of the land was next to John Foster, Senior, of Fisher's Grant.

The witnesses were John Foster, Junior, and William Foster, sons of John Foster, Senior. William Foster married John McDougall, Senior's, daughter, Isabella.

The deed was dated 11 April 1814 and was registered on 23 May 1816.

~ 1817

In 1817, John Foster was living in Pictou, Pictou county, Nova Scotia.

There were 4 people in his household.

~ 1818

John Foster had his will written on 14 February 1818. His wife and his five sons, Henry, John, William, Paul, and George are mentioned in it. So we know they were all living at that date (see below at 1825 for the details of the Will).

~ late 1824 or January 1825

John Foster died at Fisher's Grant, Pictou county, Nova Scotia probably in late 1824 or in January 1825. His Will was proven at Pictou on 25 January 1825. The Will was written on 14 February 1818, it is not certain if John Foster's wife was still alive at the time of his death in 1824 or 1825.

Do now make and declare my last Will and Testament hereby making and declaring the same in manner and form following } <u>Vizt</u>

I most humbly recommend my Soul to God most earnestly deprecating his compassion Mercy and Favour I most humbly implore his mercy and acceptance in the name of Jesus Christ my blesed Redeemer and Savior and I resign my soul with humble confidence to him in whose hands are life and death and through whom I hope for a happy resurrection

I desire that my body may be decently buried in the burying ground above the Town of Pictou. All my real Estate which I now possess I bequeath as follows.

The farm I now live on granted one by the deceased John Patterson I bequeath to my Son Paul Foster his heirs and assigns forever in consideration of Paul's paying to my oldest son Henry the sum of Five Shillings and giving my son John one Cow and to my son William one pair of three year old oxen

All my personal property consisting of Boats Tools &. e. I bequeath to my son Paul in consideration of his giving to my youngest son George the Lot of land he now holds lying on the Malignant Brook in the County of Sydney deducting from the whol of my property my Wifes proportion agreeable to law and after her decease to return to my Son Paul for satisfying and executing the foregoing Will and Testament & I hereby make constitute and appoint George Ives of Fishers Grant and James Carmichael Senior my Joint Executors to this my last Will



2. **HENRY FOSTER** was born before 1786 in England.

Henry was described as the "oldest son" in the Will of his father. Since the next brother, John Foster, was born in England it is assumed that Henry was also born there.

In the father's Will, dated 1818 and proved in 1825, it is mentioned ".... to my oldest son Henry the sum of Five Shillings."

Nothing further is known (yet) on what happened to Henry Foster after the 1818 mentioning of him in the father's Will.

3. **JOHN FOSTER** (of John Foster¹) was born ca. 1786 in London, England

Father: John Foster (No. 1)

Mother: (unknown)

~ 1786

The birth year of 1786 was calculated from the age of 82 at his death in 1868. The death certificate also stated that he was born in London.

Currently there is no records found yet that states that John Foster junior of Fisher's Grant, Pictou county is the same person as the John Foster who settled at River John, Pictou county and later Tatamagouche, Colchester county.

However, some DNA matches on Ancestry.com with descendants of William Foster and Paul Foster Sr. both of Fisher's Grant occurred with descendants of Thomas Foster the son of John Foster of River John and Tatamagouche.

~ 1807

John Foster was licensed to keep a ferry at Fisher's Grant, Pictou county, Nova Scotia.

From the book, A History of the County of Pictou, Nova Scotia, by George Patterson, 1877:

Page 209

The first notice of a ferry is in 1807, when we find "John Foster licensed to keep ferry at Fishers Grant, that he shall not charge more than 15d. for a single person, 9d. apiece for four, 6d. apiece over four, and for swimming across oxen or horses 1s. 6d. per head."

From the book, Pictou County's History, by James M. Cameron, 1972:

Page 43

Probably there was regular ferry service between Fisher's Grant (Pictou Landing) and Pictou long before 1807, a year from which there is a record of John Foster Jr., being

licensed to operate a ferry between the two places, a ferry which carried humans, and towed swimming horses and oxen at charge of 6d a head.

~ 1810s to 1820s

Nancy was born ca. 1788 in Nova Scotia.





In the 4th quarter of 1844, William Foster, age 50, and his son Henry Foster, age 30, were listed on a passenger list of the Bark Lucretia that sailed from Pictou, Pictou county, Nova Scotia and arrived at Providence, Rhode Island.







Or that Paul Foster's father who was a boat builder got a project to do in Nova Scotia and the family went there too and Paul was born there then went back to Prince Edward Island .

Paul Foster married MARY MCKAY by 1826 in Pictou county, Nova Scotia.

Their daughter, Mary Ann Foster, was born May 1827, so the marriage occurred before 1827.

Mary McKay was born ca 1803 in Pictou county, Nova Scotia and was a daughter of Donald McKay and Mary Fraser.

The birth year was calculated from the age of 57 years at her death in 1860 according to her cemetery stone (see below at 1860).

In the marriage of son, Henry H. Foster, in 1874 Bolton, Massachusetts, the mother's name is listed as "Mary A".

Since I don't see another record stating that Paul Foster's wife was Mary A., I'm leaving it as Mary McKay or Mary Foster for now.

We the subscribers, composing the Presbyterian congregation, commonly known by the name of the congregation of Pictou Harbour, taking unto consideration our destitute situation in consequence of the Reverend Thomas McCulloch D.D. our former pastor's demission of his charge, and especially that we are deprived of the public ordinances of the gospel whereby sinners are gathered unto Christ and built up in him, and in this respect are as sheep withou a sheppherd: and being well apprized of the piety, [prudence], literature, and other ininsterial qualifications of you the Rev. John McKinlay and the suitableness of the gifts bestowed on you by the blessed head of the church for our edification, we call and invite you to become our pastor, to take the charge of our souls, and the dispense to us the ordinances of grace; and we promise you all due subsistence, encouragement, and subjection in the Lord.

And we pray the Reverend the Presbytery of Pictou, under whose inspection we are, to take the necessary steps to have you placed over us as soon as circumstances will permit.

Paul Foster, age 50 and a Farmer, was on a passenger list, dated 3 August 1846, of the Brig Brothers that sailed from Pictou, Pictou county, Nova Scotia and arriving at Boston, Massachusetts.

He was probably visiting his brother's family.

George Foster, a ship carpenter of Fisher's Grant, Pictou county, Nova Scotia bought some land in Fisher's Grant from Thomas Graham, a yeoman of New Glasgow of the same county and province. The indenture was dated 25 May 1826 and was registered on 1 December 1829.

George's brother Paul Foster was a witness.

In 1829, the hull of the first steamboat in the area was built by George Foster at his shipyard in Fisher's Grant. The boat was completed by the summer of 1830.

From the book, A History of the County of Pictou, Nova Scotia, by George Patterson, 1877:

Page 405

A wharf was built at Pictou, long known as the miners wharf, and for a time coal kept there, but a depot there was found unnecessary and unprofitable. As mentioned above, the hull of a small steamer, intended to be used for towing lighters and vessels, was launched from the shipyard of Mr. George Foster, Fishers Grant, on the 19th August following.

She was called the "Richard Smith." She was towed up the river, where she remained all winter receiving her machinery, and did not commence her work till the following summer.

The Patriot of July 17th, 1830, contains the following announcement: "We stop the press to announce that the steamboat 'Richard Smith' has just appeared in the harbour for the first time."

It being the first time a steamer was seen on these waters, the whole town turned out to see the marvellous spectacle. She was first commanded by Capt. McKenzie and continued for some time to ply on the harbour.

In 1838, there was a George Foster living in Maxwelton, Pictou county, Nova Scotia. He was listed as a Shipwright.

There were 35 people in his household. Some of them probably were workers at George Foster's shipyard that were lodgers on his property

The cousin is closer to the age of the person with David Foster in the 1850 passenger list.

William Foster of Mobile, Alabama had a partner in the building of the schooner Clotilda and his name was David Foster. It would seems logical that this David Foster was William Foster's cousin. William's brother, Walter Foster, also went to Mobile, Alabama. The David Foster of Nova Scotia was a carpenter.

The thing that that goes against this is that in the 1860 census, David Foster was listed as being born in New York.

In my researches, I come across errors in the censuses. It could be because the head of the household thought he was born in New York. Or that David Foster for some reason didn't want it to be known as coming from Nova Scotia.

So the following concerns with the David Foster that was in Mobile, Alabama.

ORQUELL. - Report of Joseph Foster, Master of the barque Orquell, of Pictou (N.S.), 729 tons, from Rouen, Feb. 8, for Workington, in ballast: - Passed Havre on the 10th, and proceeded on her voyage. On the 11th, at 11 30 P.M., tide at latter part of flood, weather dark, with light rain, wind S.S.W., fresh, with a heavy rolling sea from the westward, the ship carrying maintopgallants, topsails, and courses, running with square yards, heading N. by E., Longships Light bearing about S. 14 miles; both side lights burning brightly, having been put up at 7 P.M., James Page, Second Mate in charge of the deck, and two men on the look-out forward on forecastlehead, a steamer, steering about W., showing masthead light and red light, three points on our starboard bow, struck the vessel amidships on the starboard side, breaking waterways between decks, starting the decks, and cutting into the outside plank 12 strakes down. Deponent ran on deck, when the steamer again struck this vessel by the mizenrigging, doing slight damage to bulwarks and rigging. Deponent hauled his ship to the wind, and hove to for about half an hour, and, finding that she was making no water, proceeded.

He observed the steamer until near midnight in about the same position as when the collision occurred. Deponent proceeded, and arrived at Barrow on the 13th, at 12 P.M. for repairs. The steamer appeared to be a loaded ship of about six or seven hundred tons, flush-decked, but could not ascertain her name or nationality. - Barrow, Feb. 21.

~ September 1880


In the early part of September 1880, the barque Orquell was in a collision with a large ship and was badly damaged. It occurred in thick fog in the English Channel near the coast of southern Cornwall.

COLLISION IN THE CHANNEL. - Captain Short, of the barque Peeress, of London, reported on Monday at Plymouth that on Saturday afternoon, on the dense fog, which had been prevailing throughout the day, clearing away he found the Eddystone Lighthouse bearing N. W. 1/2 W., six miles, and saw a vessel to the southward apparently much dismantled. He wore ship, and bore down on her to see if she required any assistance, but the person in charge replied in the negative.

She proved to be the barque Orquell, of Pictou, bound for London, with deals. She had been in collision with a large ship in the morning, and received considerable damage, having lost foretopmast and all yards forward, jibboom, maintop, gallant, and royal masts and other rigging. Her starboard bow was also much chafed. She was bearing for land.

Captain Joseph Foster, master of the barque Orquell, was charged with breaching a detention order placed on his ship by the Board of Trade in Great Britain. He unlawfully left the port of Bristol and headed out to sea on 12 October 1882.

When Captain Foster returned to Bristol with the barque Orquell on his next voyage, he was charged and tried at the Police court in Bristol on 9 February 1883.

From the newspaper, Gloucester Citizen, Friday 19 January 1883: Local and District News.

Serious Charge Against a Captain. - At the Bristol police-court, on Thursday, before Mr. J. F. Lucas and Mr. W. Spark, Joseph Foster, master of the barque Orquell, now lying at Sharpness Dock, Gloucester, was summoned that he, on the 12th October last, being captain of the British ship Orquell, did, after the said ship had been under the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1854 and 1876, ordered to be detained by a detaining officer of the Board of Trade, unlawfully proceed to sea with the said ship before it was released by competent authority.

Mr. Ingledew, of Cardiff, prosecuted on behalf of the Board of Trade, and Mr. Carter (instructed by Messrs. Clifton and Carter) represented the defendant.

The defendant was fined £20, including costs.

From the newspaper, Bristol Mercury, Friday 19 January 1883: BREAKING A SHIP'S DETENTION ORDER.

At the Bristol Police-court, yesterday, before the sitting justices (Aldermen Spark and Lucas), Joseph Foster, master of the barque Orquell, now lying at Sharpness Dock, was summoned for unlawfully proceeding to sea from the port of Bristol on October 12 last, he having been served with a Board of Trade provisional order for the detention of his sbip, so that she might be surveyed before proceeding on her voyage to Shediac, North America. Mr. Ingledew, Cardiff, prosecuted, and Mr. Carter (instructed by Messrs, Clifton and Carter) defended.

Mr. Ingledew, in opening the case, said defendant had been guilty of a breach of the Merchant Shipping Act of 1876. The Board of Trade, acting upon the power derived

from that Act, issued a provisional order, so that the Orquell should be surveyed before proceeding to sea and her condition reported on. On the 12th October, Mr. Neate, the detaining officer of the Board of Trade, received a report to the effect that the ship could not go sea without danger to life. On this the provisional detention order was issued, and served on defendant. In defiance of this the ship proceeded to sea, and under the circumstances the Board felt it was very necessary to prosecute.

Mr. Carter said he had gathered from what had fallen from his friend that there was no imputation that the barque herself was unseaworthy, and that the defendant was simply proceeded against for non-compliance with the Board of Trade order. He might at once state that his client had no desire to evade the law. He was placed in such a position that he was bound to rely solely upon his judgment, but in leaving the port there was no wilful disobedience on his part. Under the circumstances in which he was placed, and knowing the condition of his ship much better than any informer could, he felt bound to go. The ship was Canadian built, and was classed A l, for a long period.

Mr. Ingledew pointed out that the order was issued for the express purpose of having the vessel surveyed. The defendant was served with the proper notice.

Mr. Carter was bound to admit that this was so. He did not complain at all of the action taken by the Board of Trade. The captain was served with a detention order which alleged that the vessel was in a condition which endangered human life. He had gone to sea and had come back to England in perfect safety. He, however, admitted that he had been guilty of a formal breach of the order.

The magistrates pointed out that if the vessel had been detained, and the survey showed that the delay occasioned was unnecessary, the Act provided that the Board of Trade should compensate the owners for any loss which might have been incurred.

Mr. Carter explained that the Orquell was bound to a place in the northern latitudes, and a week's delay or even two days meant that she would have been caught by the Arctic winter, and had to remain icebound throughout the season. His confidence in the seaworthiness of his ship was unbounded, and the result justified it, as he brought her and the crew safely back to the Bristol Channel.

Mr. Ingledew stated that the nature of the ballast which defendant had shipped was the real cause of the provisional order being issued. It was of the same description as taken on board the Golden Sea and the Acme, and which was proved at the inquiries held into the loss of those vessels to be exceedingly dangerous. It consisted of nothing more than road scrapings, red marl, and brick ends. Sbips only just off the stocks would occasionally make water, and had the Orquell done so the greater part of her ballast would have teen soluble, and, as in the other cases, her pumps become choked The magistrates said the Act was particularly clear, and there could be no doubt but that defendant had committed a breach of the section under which he was summoned. Mr. Carter replied that he could not gainsay that defendant had broken the letter of the Act, and asked the bench to regard the fact that the ship was brought back to England safely. As to the ballast he was in a position to prove that it was of the best description,

and not of the nature pronounced by his friend. He was informed that there was a considerable quantity remaining in her hold at the present moment which could be produced if required.

The magistrates said this was scarcely the point, Defendant was charged with going to sea before the detention order on the ship had been properly released.

Mr. Ingledew asked the magistrates not to take into consideration that the ship had returned safely, but to support the authority of the Board of Trade, and thus assist in the prevention of a recurrence of a matter of that description.

Mr. Carter thought the justices could very well take the point into their consideration as a mitigating circumstance. He would also submit to the court that it was no wilful infringement of the order on the part of the defendant, but, being in a dilemma, he had to rely on his own will, and for his owners' sake choes the lesser evil of the two, or, in other words, he went to sea knowing that his vessel was thoroughly seaworthy, rather than by a late passage run the risk of becoming ice-bound. On his return to England be at once wrote to the Board of Trade explaining the matter.

Formal evidence on both sides having been taken, The magistrates said there was no doubt that there had been a breach of the law. There was no insinuation in the case that the ship was not seaworthy, but the clause under which the proceedings were taken was very clear. Making every allowance for the position the captain found himself in, they were still of opinion that, as a good subject, he ought to have respected the detention order. The court imposed a penalty of £20.

Costs were not awarded, as the Board of Trade in such cases does not ask for any.

~ 1887

In September 1887, the barque Orquell laden with heavy iron ore started taking on water in a major storm out in the Atlantic Ocean. The ship was sinking. By a miracle, there happened to be another ship, the steamer Endymion, in the area and spotted the barque Orquell. The crew of the ship rescued all the crew and Captain William Brown.

Captain Joseph Foster hasn't been the master of the barque Orquell for about 2 or 3 years, but he would be saddened by the news of the ship sinking as he was the captain of it for the first five years.

From the newspaper, The Scotsman, Monday 12 September 1887: CASUALTIES TO SHIPPING. ---

A report from Lloyd's, dated September 10, says: --- The steamer Endymion, which arrived at Gravesend last evening from New York, has on board the captain and crew of the barque Orquell, of Picton, N.S., from Barrow to New York, with a cargo of iron ore. The Endymion fell in with her in a sinking condition on Monday last, in lat. 48.26 N., long. 17.31 W., and with extreme difficulty succeeded in getting the whole of the crew safely on board.

In doing this, two of the steamer's boats were damaged, and one of the davits broken. The Endymion experienced very heavy weather during the voyage, in which they lost 30 head of cattle.

THANKS. --- To the Editor. --- I shall be obliged if you will kindly convey publicly through your Paper the sincere thanks of myself and crew, to the master, officers, and crew, of the Endymion (s), for the able and seamanlike manner in which they effected our rescue from the abandoned barque Orquell, under circumstances of extreme difficulty, and at the risk of their own lives.

Also for the kind and considerate treatment we received from Captain Saterley and his officers, whilst on board the Endymion. --- Yours truly, Wm. BROWN, late master of abandoned barque Orquell. --- London, Sept. 12, 1887.

From where the barque Orquell was found sinking, Latitude 48° 26 North Longitude 17° 31 West, it was very lucky that there was another ship in the area to be able to rescue the crew that far out in the sea. In most case it would be a ship lost at sea with all crew drowned.





~ 1889

In 1889, Jessie Foster's father, Donald McArthur, died. He had a Will written in 1882 and it mentions that he gave Jessie a property.

"In witness whereof I have hereunto my hand and Seal Subscribed and Set at Fisher's Grant this 30th. day of October A.D. 1882.

The year of birth was calculated to him being born in 1825 in several records. The 1900 census gives the birth month and year as August 1825.

~ 1844

The 1900 census states that William Foster immigrated to the U. S. in 1844 and that he became a naturalized citizen (see 1900 census below for details).

Research note:

There are two passenger lists that have a William Foster arriving in Providence, Rhode Island in 1844 from Nova Scotia and were carpenters by trade. But the ages of each William Foster were off by several years so I could not declare which one was the right one.

~ 1850

William Foster was not found in the 1850 census of United States. It could be that he was listed as born in U.S. or on a page faded or writing difficult.

~ 1855 & 1860

Earliest record found to date of William Foster being in Mobile, Alabama was when they finished building the Schooner Clotilda in 1855. Obviously he was there before 1855. The following excerpts are from the book by Silviane A. Diouf which mentions about the Clotilda and the voyage. It is an interesting book.

From the book, Dreams of Africa in Alabama, by Silviane A. Diouf, 2007:

Page 24

"This time around, to go to the African coast Meaher and Foster chose the Clotilda, a schooner Foster had built a few years earlier. The ship's birth had not gone unnoticed. On October 17, 1855, a Mobile newspaper published news of the vessel:

The Clotilda. Such is the name of a beautiful schooner built by Mr. Foster at his shipyard opposite the city, and which is now receiving her rigging at the foot of St. Anthony Street. This vessel in model and fastning does great credit to her builder, and afford another evidence of the capacity of our city for successful and economical shipbuilding. She is light and commodious, draws thirty inches forward and forty-two inches aft, and

is intended for the Texas trade. Her tonnage is 137, Custom House measure, and her model is of that graceful turn which confers assurance that she will prove a fast sailor. Foster had registered the Clotilda on April 19 (1855) with the Customs Service. Her length was eighty-six feet; her breadth, twenty-three; and she had two masts and one deck. Her tonnage was given as 120 81/91 tons."

Page 2-3

"The man at the origin of their dreadful journey, Timothy Meaher, owned a plantation and, with his brothers James and Burns, a shipyard and several steamers. As some people in the South were agitating for the reopening of the international slave trade, he had bet a large sum that he could bring a "shipful of n-----s" to Mobile and not be caught.

His accomplice in the scheme, William Foster, was the builder of the Clotilda. With his schooner disguised as an innocuous cargo ship, Foster sailed to Ouidah in March 1860. There in a barracoon near the beach, he selected nineteen-year-old Kossola -who became Cudjo Lewis; Kehounco, a young girl who had been kidnapped; Arzuma, a Muslim woman from the North; and dozens of their companions."

Page 75

"Captain Foster climbed aboard the now empty Clotilda, where he had spent sixteen weeks. He had one more thing to do. His ship was not going to get a new life after all." "The Clotilda sailed into Bayou Canot, northwest of Twelve-Mile Island, and put down anchor. Seven cords of lightwood were placed in strategic locations. Foster lighted them up, walked down the plank, and took a last look at his fine ship. The infamous Clotilda went up in smoke."

~ 1859

The schooner Clotilda arrived in Mobile, Alabama on 25 July 1859 from a trip from Galveston, Texas.



12. **ANN FOSTER** (of William Foster², of John Foster¹) (also known as Anna) was born 8 March 1823 in Fisher's Grant, Pictou, Nova Scotia and died in 11 April 1889 age 66 years at Fisher's Grant.

Father: William Foster (No. 4)
Mother: Isabella McDougall

Anna Foster married **JOHN NAIRN** before 1852. John Nairn was born 1815 in Pictou, Pictou County, Nova Scotia and died in 7 September 1885 at Pictou Landing (Fisher's Grant), Nova Scotia. He was a son of James and Agnes (McNeil) Nairn.

John Nairn's father, James Nairn, died when they were living in Pictou when he was 3 years old. His mother, Agnes, then married Peter Christie and they moved across the harbour to Fisher's Grant in the 1820's to 1830's.

In 1833, John Nairn's grandfather, John McNeil Sr., died and in his Will, John McNeil Sr. left his grandson, John Nairn, ten pounds.

John Nairn became a Ferryman with a ship going back and forth across the harbour from Fisher's Grant to Pictou transporting people, horses, cattle, and supplies.

Also he has been buying properties in different locations according to deeds records from the years 1844 to 1866.

In 14 January 1846 a petition was made by John McPherson and John Nairn, both of Fisher's Grant. John McPherson and John Nairn were licensed ferrymen and they petitioned to the Representatives of the People of Nova Scotia in the General Assembly.

It mentioned the ongoing problem that an unlicensed ferryman, Donald McDougall, was operating a ferry between Pictou and Fisher's Grant and took away about half the earnings that would of otherwise gone to John McPherson and John Nairn.

Donald McDougall continued even that he was summoned and convicted of several offense.

"...That no Sooner did the said Donald McDougall find that he could not ferry in opposition to your petitioners for hire than he fell upon a new plan and fixed a box in the stern of his boat on which the words "poor box" were painted and there was an aperture in it into which those who encouraged his boat or took passage therein were in the habit of dropping the fare "

The results of this petition is not known.

On 4 February 1856 another Petition from John McPherson and John Nairn, ferrymen was started. "..... That the Ferry Wharf at Fisher's Grant is in great want of Repairs and Extention. That it is now landed up so that Boats cannot land sometimes at low tides at the outer end of said Wharf....."

The petition asks for a sum so they can do repair and extension. It is signed by 55 of Fisher's Grant's men. The results of this petition is not known.

John Nairn was in the ferry business for many years and later became a Ship Captain.

In 1861 John Nairn and his family, a total of 4 males and 2 females were living in Fisher's Grant.

Construction of the railroad to Pictou Landing in 1867 brought the large iron steamship, May Flower, into service for InterColonial Railway (ICR) between the railhead at Pictou Landing (Fisher's Grant) and Pictou, a service which connected train passengers, freight, and mail.

The May Flower carried sixty passengers in her Saloon. It was a large steam ferry that was 125 feet long and a beam of 23 1/2 feet.

In 14 April 1871, John Nairn, age 54 and his wife Ann Nairn age 47 and their 5 children were living in Fisher's Grant. John Nairn was a Captain

In McAlpine's Maritime Provinces, 1871, it listed Captain John Nairn as master mariner. In Lovell's Province of Nova Scotia Directory of 1871, it listed at Fisher's Grant, Captain John Nairn, Pictou ferryboat.

From a List of Patrons in the 1879 Pictou county Atlas it mentioned "Nairn, Capt. John Capt. of the Mayflower born in N.S."

In 1881, John Nairn, age 65, and his wife Ann Nairn, age 60, and three of their children were living in Fisher's Grant. John Nairn was a Steamboat Captain.

John and Anna Nairn's son, John George, died at the age of 28 years.

John Nairn died in 1885. The obituary mentioned "NAIRN - At Pictou Landing, September 7th, Capt. John Nairn in his 70th year".

John Nairn's will is dated 22nd day of June 1883 and proved and registered 19th September 1885. It was probably written shortly after the death of his son John George Nairn.

"..... I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Ann all my personal property remaining after my lawful debts are paid I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Ann all my Real Estate to be held in trust during her natural life for my two daughters Anna Bell and Catherine Bain and at her death to be equally divided between them, Share and Share alike...... I hereby nominate and appoint my Son James Nairn to be my Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament"

Anna Foster died in 1889 at the age of 66 in Fisher's Grant.

At Greenwood Cemetery in Pictou Landing, Nova Scotia, there is a stone:

John Nairn died 1885 age 70 yrs

wf. Anna Foster died 1889 age 66 yrs

John G. Nairn died 1883 age 28 yrs

Concerning the steamship May Flower, it was built in 1868 at Pictou by Sandford Fleming of Halifax. After its service for ICR, it was sold in 1879 and renamed the May Queen. The ship was destroyed by fire June 8, 1898 in Baddeck Harbour.

13. **DANIEL FOSTER** (of William Foster², of John Foster¹) was born 3 May 1825 in Fisher's Grant, Pictou, Nova Scotia and died 4 November 1891 at age 66 years.

Father: William Foster (No. 4)
Mother: Isabella McDougall

In the third quarter of 1844, the Brig "Lucretia", with John S. Adamson as its Master, arrived at Providence, Rhode Island after a voyage from Pictou, Nova Scotia on 9 September 1844. In the Passenger lists was Daniel Foster, age 19, Shipwright. Also in the list was his cousin Ann Foster, age 22, Servant; Jane Foster, age 18, Servant (do not know how she is related to the Foster family); and David McDougall, age 23, Farmer (probably a cousin).

In the second quarter of 1846, the Brig "Rainbow", British, with Israel Church as its Master, arrived at Providence, Rhode Island after a voyage from Pictou, Nova Scotia on 23 June 1846. In the Passenger lists was Daniel Foster, age 21, Ship Carpenter.

In the late 1840's, Daniel Foster went to Warren, Bristol County, Rhode Island where he was in the shipbuilding business. His brother Thomas R. Foster went there too.

In 1850, Daniel Foster age 24, shipwright was living with the family of Waite Humphrey age 45 in Warren, Bristol County, Rhode Island. Daniel soon married one of Waite Humphrey's daughters.

Daniel Foster married **WAITY A. HUMPHRIES** on 14 December 1851 at Warren, Bristol County, Rhode Island. Waity was born ca. 1826 in Rhode Island. She was a daughter of Waite Humphrey, her father's name is not known. He was probably dead by 1850, since Waite Humphrey (age 45) was the head of the family.

In 1853, a Clipper Ship named "Pride of the Ocean" was launched at Warren, Bristol County, Rhode Island. It was built by Daniel Foster. It was owned by Cady, Aldrich & Reid of the port of Providence, Rhode Island.

Daniel Foster's wife Waite died 24 April 1861 in Warren, Bristol Co., Rhode Island. She is buried at South Burial Ground in Warren.

In 1857, Daniel and Thomas Foster decided to move to Hawaii to try the shipbuilding business in the Pacific. It appears that Thomas Foster was the main brother involved in

the Shipbuilding business in Hawaii (See Thomas R. Foster for more about the business in Hawaii)

In 1880, Daniel Foster was in Oakland, Alameda County, California. Daniel is age 54 and is a Coal Dealer. Daniel's son and daughter, William and Hattie are present. They have a Chinese cook living with them, his name was Jo, age 20 born in China.

There was also another family living with them, Margarette and Nellie Fuller. Nellie was also born in Sandwich Island (Hawaii).

James Robinson, an Englishman, who arrived in Honolulu in 1820, established a ship building business and leased major O`ahu lands prior to the Great Mahele. Following the Great Mahele, the land was purchased by Robinson.

Today in Hawaii the Robinson influence still exist. The Mark A. Robinson Trust, the current landholdings include 2,860 acres of primarily commercial, residential and agricultural usage.

On March 4, 1866, the Brennen barque Libelle, under command of Captain Tobias, went ashore on the east reef at Wake Island. On board were several prominent passengers and a cargo valued at over \$300,000.

Several vessels went to Wake Island to salvage the cargo, which included several hundred flasks of quicksilver. The sloop Hokulele, with a party headed by T.R. Foster, left Honolulu May 9, 1867, reached Wake on May 31st, left there June 22, and returned to Honolulu July 29, 1867 with 247 flasks of quicksilver.

Thomas Foster, Captain, returned to Wake Island with eight Hawaiian divers, landed at Wake Island from the Hawaiian schooner Moi Wahine in September, 1867.

Three days after their arrival their schooner, with Captain Zenas Bent in command, mate Wight, and a crew of five, was driven to sea by a gale and not heard again.

The salvage party was rescued by the English brig Cleo, Captain Cargell, in March, 1868, and returned to Honolulu on April 29, with 240 flasks of quicksilver, some copper, anchor and chain.

Captain Thomas R. Foster was having a fleet of steamers built by Hall Brothers at Port Ludlow, Washington. His steamers were the James Makee (June, 1879), C. R. Bishop (1880) and Iwalani (March, 1881).

In 1883, Foster's fleet became known as the Inter-Island Steam Navigation Company. Mail among the islands in the 1880's and 1890's was carried almost solely by the steamers operated by Thomas Foster and two other companies.

The Foster Botanical Garden is the oldest in Hawaii and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Garden originated in 1853 when the Hawaiian Queen, Kalama, leased land to William Hillebrand, a German physician and botanist who built his home here and planted trees that now grace the area.

Mr. Hillibrand who started the botanical garden in Honolulu, sold his Hawaiian home in 1880 to a neighbor, a young entrepreneur from Nova Scotia and his part-Hawaiian wife, Thomas and Mary Foster.

With financial help from Mary's father, the Fosters bought property just mauka of the Hillebrands' driveway near the intersection of Nu'uanu Avenue and School Street. There, they built a modest residence and settled down. Years later in 1880 when Hillebrand decided not to return to Hawai'i, he sold the house and gardens to the Fosters.

In 1884, the Fosters removed the existing Hillebrand house and built a mansion with a 5-story tower which would allow Thomas to see his passing ships. Mary enjoyed the gardens and spent much of her time renovating them. One of her contributions was the building of an auwai, or canal system for irrigation. The gardens remained a place for the Foster family to play and relax.

Thomas passed away five years later in 1889 and left Mary alone. For several years, Mary chose to live at her sister's home. With the Nu'uanu house empty, the Foster gardens fell into a state of disrepair. Mary later returned, but found the tangles of the garden appealing and refused to have them thinned. She continued to add to the gardens and is responsible for the exceptional Bo Tree found in the garden today, a specimen propagated from what is believed to be the oldest historical tree in the world.

Another figure of great importance to Foster Botanical Garden was Harold L. Lyon. Lyon moved to Hawai'i from Minnesota in 1907 to work for the Hawaii Sugar Planters Association (HSPA). Besides working on projects to cure diseases afflicting sugar cane, Lyon also worked on projects that sought to reforest the watershed areas of the island, an issue important to sugar planters. Lyon was a botanist who specialized in trees and it is understandable how the towering trees of the Foster gardens enticed him to seek out Mary Foster and develop a formal relationship with the widow.

Through encouragement from Lyon, Mary decided the gardens were special, yet were in need of constant maintenance to repair years of neglect. In an agreement which helped the sugar planters, but was also an opportunity for Mary to ensure Lyon would remain on-site to supervise her gardens, Mary leased the HSPA nearly two acres of her property fronting Vineyard Street as an addition to their nursery. Her only stipulation required that the HSPA gardens were made to complement her already existing gardens. As a result, the grounds were graded and one of the first HSPA experiment stations was established at the property. By 1925, Lyon had developed what he considered the best-equipped plant nursery in the Hawaiian Islands.

In the 1930 Census of Honolulu we find Mary Mikahale Foster, age 86, widow, living at the home of her sister, Victoria Ward at the corner of King and Ward Street. She was listed as a Manager - General Merchandise.

Victoria Ward and her husband, Curtis Perry Ward, once owned an estate comprising over 100 acres in central Honolulu. At its greatest extent, these lands stretched all the way from Thomas Square to the shore. Until Hawaiian property laws changed in the 1870's, the Ward's stewardship responsibilities included all of the fringing reef fronting their property as well as fishing rights that extended indefinitely out to sea. Victoria was born in Nu'uanu in 1846, the daughter of English shipbuilder, James Robinson and his wife, Rebecca Previer, a woman of Hawaiian ancestry whose chiefly lineage had roots in Ka'u, Hilo and Honokowai, Maui.

On December 19, 1930, Mary Foster died at the age of 86. She bequeathed her home and gardens (approximately 5 acres) to the City of Honolulu. She placed a stipulation on the transferal of the property that required the City and County of Honolulu to "accept and forever keep and properly maintain the (gardens) as a public and tropical park to be known and called Foster Park" and left \$10,000 for initial improvements.

The Department of Parks was able to accept the gift and Foster Park and Gardens opened its doors to the public on November 30, 1931.

Dr. Harold Lyon, the first director of Foster Garden, introduced thousands of new plants and trees to Hawaii, and started the famous orchid collection. Paul Weissich, director from 1957 to 1989, expanded Foster Garden to 14 acres of native plants and introduced plants in the heart of bustling downtown Honolulu, and developed four additional sites on Oahu Island to create the 650-acre Honolulu Botanical Gardens system.

The five gardens feature rare species from tropical environments ranging from desert to rainforest.

Thomas and Mary Foster did not have any children. But the Foster Botanical Gardens and Park is still around to remind us about them.

Diadama (also known as Dama) was born 23 May 1852 at Clearfield, Clearfield, Pennsylvania and died 18 September 1937 in Taylor, Williamson, Texas. She was a daughter of Aaron and Emily (Estes) Owens.

William E. Foster probably left Fisher's Grant, Nova Scotia in the 1860's and went to Minnesota. William met Diadama Owens in Hutchinson, McLeod County, Minnesota where she was living with her widowed mother. They probably got married in 1870.

During the time of the 1870 Census, W. M. and Damma J. Foster were living in Acoma, McLeod County, Minnesota. According to the census, it is erroneously listed that W. M. Foster was born in Massachusetts.

In 1880, William and Dama J. Foster with their 3 children were living in Swan Lake, Meeker County, Minnesota. William Foster was listed as a farmer.

In 1884, William Foster and family moved from Hutchinson, Minnesota to Taylor, Williamson County, Texas.

From an article in the Taylor Press 1956, it mentioned "Mr. Foster was in the hauling business and the family home was located where the Lone Star Gas Company office is located today, and Mr. Foster owned that block including the corner where the Methodist church is now."

In Taylor, he was joined up with his brothers, Paul J. Foster, Joseph R. Foster, and their father, Paul Foster, Senior who was in his late 80's at that time.

In the 1884 Census of the city of Taylor, William Foster's is listed there. William was a Carpenter.

In the 1890 Census of the City of Taylor, Williamson, Texas, Dama Foster is listed with her 4 children.

In the 1900 Census of Williamson County, Texas, Walter and Roxia Smith, were listed with their two daughters Mary and Mildred. Also living with them were, John P. Smith the father and D. J. Foster the mother-in-law.

Diadama Foster married 2nd to John Poindexter Smith after 1900. John P. Smith was born 14 October 1836 in Tennessee and died 18 July 1906 in Taylor, Williamson, Texas. John P. Smith was married before and had a son Walter C. Smith, who married Diadama Foster's daughter.

In the 1920 Census we find Dama J. Smith in Precinct 1, Bexar County, Texas, she was a widow 65 years old.

Diadama Smith died at Taylor 18 September 1937.

Joseph Foster married **AGNES ----? ----** before 1876.

59. **JOHNSON ARCHIBALD NAIRN** (of Ann Foster³, of William Foster², of John Foster¹) was born 1 January 1858 in Fisher's Grant, Pictou County, Nova Scotia and died 28 August 1911 in New York City, N.Y.

Father: John Nairn

Mother: Ann Foster (No. 12)

Johnson Archibald Nairn was born and raised in Fisher's Grant, Nova Scotia.

In April 14, 1871, Johnson Archibald Nairn, age 13, was living with his parents in Fisher's Grant.

His father was a ship captain. Johnson Nairn probably met Annie Wall in the late 1870s when the Wall Family moved from Pictou across the harbor to Pictou Landing.

Annie Wall's father, Isaac Wall, was the switchman for the I.C.R. at Pictou Landing. Johnson's father, John Nairn, was the captain of the I.C.R. Steamship Mayflower that picked up people and freight at the railhead at Pictou Landing and transported them across the harbor to Pictou.

Eventually Annie Wall's brother, Judson Wall, joined the I.C.R. and became a train engineer. Johnson Nairn's brother, James W. Nairn, became a train engineer too. So the Wall family and the Nairn family had several connections with the Intercolonial Railway.

Johnson Nairn around 1880 went to New York City. Johnson found a place to live and took a job as a machinist. In 1881, Johnson Nairn returned to Pictou Landing to marry Annie Wall.

Johnson A. Nairn married **ANN PETINA WALL** on 21 September 1881 at Pictou Landing , Nova Scotia.

Annie Wall was born 28 July 1860 at Freetown, Prince Edward Island and died 8 August 1942 at the age of 82 years in Ridgewood, New Jersey. She was a daughter of Isaac Wall and Jane Van Buskirk.

Then the two of them went back to New York City. Johnson and Annie were living at 427 Grand Street in New York City.

Johnson Nairn made his intentions of becoming a U.S. Citizen on October 1, 1885, they were then living at 168 Clinton Street, New York City. He was granted citizenship on the 22nd day of October 1888. His witness was Nathan J. Wadhaus who knew him since June 1882.

Johnson was for a while a member of the Royal Arcanium, a lodge in New

York City. It was similar to the Masonic lodges. Johnson had a gold watch chain with a medallion attached to the chain. The medallion has a crown on it which is the symbol of the Royal Arcanium.

Over the years Johnson moved up to higher positions. He started as a machinist, then became a mechanical engineer, and it was mentioned in the family that he later became superintendent of a shipyard probably located in New York City or Brooklyn in New York or in Newark or Hoboken area of New Jersey. The exact location is not known.

By the year 1900 they were living at 344 Kosciusko Street in Brooklyn, New York.

In 1908 to 1911 they were living at 784 Quincy Drive. Annie Nairn may have been a member of the Green Avenue Baptist Church of Brooklyn.

According to the family, there was a story about Johnson Nairn. Before, or in 1911, there was a labor strike going on in which some violence broke out at the shipyard where Johnson Nairn was a superintendent. Johnson, because he was a boss, had to worry a lot about the situation and also work a lot harder.

In August of 1911, Johnson fell very ill and was suffering convulsions which led to his death on 28 August 1911. In the New York Times issue of 30 August 1911 "Johnson A. Nairn - 784 Quincy Street Aug. 28 Funeral notice later"

Annie Petina Nairn remained a widow for the next 31 years. Later Annie Nairn lived at President Street in Brooklyn. Two of her grand-children Everett H. Hendrickson and Mildred Nairn Hendrickson were born at that location.

In 1930, Anne P. Nairn was living with her daughter, Mildred Wallworth, and her family in Glen Rock, Bergen County, New Jersey. My father, Robert Wallworth, remembers his grandmother living with them when he was a kid.

My father, Robert Wallworth, also remembers Mr. Van Buskirk, a relative came to New Jersey to visit Annie Nairn. He remembers that he had a bushy mustache. He also remembers that Annie Nairn had many visits from her sister Ruby Whiston, with her husband the Reverend Robert Whiston, and another sister Janie Fisher during the 1930s. Annie Nairn told her grandchildren stories about the family, about the Walls, the Nairns and the Van Buskirks and about the family being Tories during the Revolution.

Annie Nairn later lived at 17 Christopher Place, Ridgewood, N.J. at the Hendrickson home until she died three years later on August 8,1942 at the age of 82 years.

Johnson and Annie Nairn are both buried at Maple Grove Cemetery at Kew Gardens, Long Island, N.Y. Johnson was buried on August 31, 1911 and Annie was buried August 11, 1942.
