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
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#### Ramblings (Introductory and Comments)



Map of the Newmarket area of England from a website on Roman roads in Britannia. In this map, it shows the Roman road from near Great Shelford going through Newmarket and onto Thetford.

This area is where the counties of Cambridge, Norfolk and Suffolk meets.

Newmarket on the border is part in Suffolk (St. Mary, Newmarket) and part in Cambridgeshire (All Saints, Newmarket). So in the writings below, you will see it involves both parts of Newmarket.

Thetford, Norfolk was where John and Harriet Pettingale were in the early 1820's. It is less than 7 miles from Brandon, Suffolk across the border.

It is shown before that George Pickingill (1816-1909) was living in Gravesend, Kent for a few years in the 1850's at the time when he married his wife.

There was a man name Francis Pettingale that was a coachman living in Gravesend in the 1850's till his death in 1862. His wife and young children ran a boarding house afterwards.

In the records, George Pickingill's name was spelled Pickingale and Pettingale more than Pickingill.

I have the feeling that Francis Pettingale was related somehow, perhaps 2nd cousins. The research is complicated with the following issues:

First, we do not know where Thomas Pickingill (1747-1804) of Canewdon came from before or the names of his parents.

Second, we also don't know how the father of George Pickingill, Charles Pickingill (1790-1867) of Canewdon and Hockley was related to Thomas Pickingill.

Third, on the research on Francis Pettingale, we can only go back to his grandfather. The family was in Newmarket, Suffolk for two generations, but it is not known where John Pettingale (1760-1840) came from.

I find the Pettingale of Newmarket and Gravesend very interesting.

They were involved with horses. They would know of other contacts for disposing stolen horses.

Also Francis Pettingale's brother Henry Pettingale was the gatekeeper to the horse racing at Newmarket and he was known at other racing events at other places in England.

Another brother, Robert Pettingale became a Commission Agent at Newmarket races. He would be taking bets, etcs. He also trained racing greyhounds. Robert Pettingale knew Baron Rothschild and his people.

Also a sister, Frances Pettingale married William Harris. They were Servant and Valet to Raglan G. H. Somerset for many years in London. Raglan was an upper class person, he was a son of a Lord and a grandson of a Duke.

Then Raglan was an employee to the ultimate upper class person..... the Queen Victoria. Raglan was one of the Gentlemen Ushers Quarterly Waiters for Queen Victoria. He worked at Buckingham Palace from 1873 to 1901.

So this research also shows that the Pickingill / Pettingale people had ways of meeting some upper class occult people through these contacts.

It appeared that the deceased and her husband had lived on very bad terms - that just before the poor woman destroyed herself they had quarrelled, and he had pushed her down, by which one of the bones of her wrist was broken, and about three quarters of an hour afterwards she was found by the servant suspended from a bed-post; the husband was informed of it, and instead of going immediately to the body, he replied, "Oh, d--n it," and continued employing himself about his work, and it was not until he was a second time appealed to, that he would go to the body. Witnesses proved that the deceased was addicted to drinking, and did not appear quite right in her mind, and that in frequent guarrels she had with her husband she was as much in fault as the man.

The jury returned a verdict, that she hanged herself whilst labouring under temporary derangement.
