


These two pictures are what I have in the current Pickingill History. I tried the best to edit it from the poor image picture found on the internet.





Then I recently found another picture (of the same) of George Pickingill on the internet. From an image that was sharper but more darker (as you can see details of the fence, etc. became darker). I edited it more to make the overall picture better.





The details of the eyes are better than the one I have.

Hopefully someday someone will make a larger scan of the original photograph that was in Mike Howard's possession.

~ Analysis

The photograph that was in Mike Howard's possession looks more of a photograph made in the early 1900's.

The photo was most likely taken when the newspaper reporter visited him 1908. Word spread of George Pickingill's supposed longevity. They though he was over a century old.

George Pickingill's actual age in 1908 was around 92.

Mike Howard got the photograph from Lillian May (Higby) Garner "Granny Garner" of Canewdon, Essex.

Mrs. Garner probably got the photograph from Charles Frederick Pickingill (eldest son of George), also living in Canewdon. She either got the photo from him directly or after his death in 1928 when perhaps his belongings were sold off in a sale.

John Pope claims the photo was made in the early 1960's.

Okay... let's look at the facts....

First, the photograph is not typical of photographs taken in the 1960's.

Alf Cavill would have been at the age of 46 in 1960 and age of 50 in 1964 which would be the end of the "early 1960's".

Does the photograph look like a man age 46 to 50 or of a man around the age of 92? To me it looks like a 92 years old.

Also would an old man using a walking stick be working as a station porter?

Also, John Pope mentioned that Alf Cavill laughed when he showed him the Pickingill picture that probably was in a book or magazine. If I saw a picture of myself in a book or magazine without my permission, I would have a very different reaction.

Alf Cavill was most likely laughing at the fact that this young guy thinks that he was the person in the picture.

John Pope is a common name. But this person obviously read books about witches and magicians. Which kind of narrows down the field.


A friend of mine recently sent me an image of a letter that was in Cecil Williamson's document collection. It was not dated but probably from the 1970's. The letterhead surprised me.

The address is located in Barnet, Hertfordshire which is about 5 miles from the train station in Elstree, Hertfordshire where Alf Cavill was a station porter.

Could he be the same John Pope who met Alf Cavill?

A few months after the death of Alfred C. Cavill, a letter was published in the Insight magazine. The writer of the letter, John Pope, claimed that the photograph of George Pickingill of Canewdon, Essex was actually that of Alf Cavill the station porter in Elstree, Hertfordshire.

From the book, Pop! Goes the Witch, 2004, edited by Fiona Horne:

Issue number 31 of *Insight* magazine, dated July 1984, contains a very interesting letter from John Pope: "The photograph purporting to be Old George Pickingill is in fact a photo of Alf Cavill, a station porter at Ellstree, taken in the early 1960s. Alf is now dead, but he was no witch, and laughed over the photograph when he saw it."

However, a very respected Craft authority has told me that he believes the photo, which is in his possession, to be of Pickingill, and I have no reason to disbelieve him.

For several years, I have been trying to locate a copy of the Insight magazine in the hope that the magazine had more information about the letter than mentioned in the book.

A fellow researcher and friend, Melissa Seims, obtained from Julia Phillips a copy of the page that contained John Pope's letter in the Insight magazine.

From the magazine, Insight, Issue No. 31, July 1984: Dear Sir,

I see more claims Re. Pickingill controversy in 'Insight' again. Jean Bann, an Alexandrian Witch from Southend puts the other side of the coin. She says there were no witches in Canewdon and the whole story was invented by Eric Maple in his 'Dark world of the Witches'. The photograph purporting to be Old George Pickingill is in fact, a photo of Alf Cavill, a station porter of Ellstree, taken in the early 1960's. Alf is now dead, but he was no witch and laughed over the photograph when he saw it.

So the addresses matched. It was the John Pope of The United Temples of Satan of Barnet, Hertfordshire who wrote the letter to the Insight magazine in 1984.

Perhaps he did thought that Alf Cavill looked like George Pickingill.
